

## About us

The **Maria Sibylla Merian Institute for Advanced Studies in Africa (MIASA)** is dedicated to the topic of 'Sustainable Governance'. MIASA's main interdisciplinary research foci are: sustainable environmental transformation, sustainable conflict management, and sustainable democracy. MIASA's overarching aims are working towards a reduction of global asymmetries in knowledge production and bridging the cultural divide between anglophone and francophone Africa. MIASA will serve as a hub for exchange, networking and collaboration amongst leading researchers from Germany, Ghana, the African continent and beyond. It will also offer funding opportunities for early career researchers.

MIASA is located at the **University of Ghana**, Legon, Accra, with a secondary site located at the **Centre de Recherches sur les Politiques Sociales (CREPOS)** in Dakar, Senegal. It is thus the first Institute for Advanced Studies in Sub-Saharan Africa outside of South Africa.

MIASA's programmes are funded by the **German Federal Ministry of Education and Research**, while its local staffing, administrative and operational costs are borne by the University of Ghana.

## Events & Fellow Groups

MIASA will be launched with an international **conference** at the University of Ghana, Accra, on **27 & 28 September 2018**. The topic of the conference is **Africa's Institutions for Sustainable Governance**.

In the preliminary phase (2018-2020), MIASA will host four Interdisciplinary Fellow Groups (IFGs). The groups will convene for a period of two to four months at its University of Ghana location, each group consisting of eight to twelve scholars who will collaborate on a research question linked to the sustainable governance topic:

**IFG 1:** Migration, Mobility, and Forced Displacement  
(February to May 2019)

**IFG 2:** Parliaments and Democracy in Africa  
(September to December 2019)

**IFG 3:** Sustainable Rural Transformation in the Context of Increased Commercialization and Resource Scarcity  
(February to May 2020)

**IFG 4:** Sustainable Energy Transitions in Africa  
(September to December 2020)

Additional conferences, workshops, summer schools, and public lectures are planned from December 2018 onwards. During the core phase (2020-2026), MIASA will offer an individual fellowship and policy fellowship programmes.
